

European rail wiki and 'literary Instagram' among winners of EU @diversity Awards

Projects from across rere honoured in the @diversity Awards www.at-diversity.eu/) and will now receive coaching EU, before enjoying the opportunity to pitch their ideas to investors.

The @diversity Idea Competition has been created in order to discover as yet untested ideas that could potentially shape the future of the cultural and creative sectors in Europe if they have competitive business models built behind them.



Make Culture winners

The winners are divided between four categories, the first of which, Make Culture, includes two projects focusing on transforming the experience of visiting an art gallery. SMartART allows visitors to use their smartphone cameras to identify works of art and pull up extra information about them. Sonic Paintings (http://www.wired.co.uk/news/archive/2013-11/04/sonicpaintings), on the other hand, sparks soundscapes for spectators to listen to when they are standing in front of a painting in order to provide them with a multi-sensory in-gallery experience.

The third winner in this category is a project called ReWalk Europe from British company MotiRoti, which is in the business of using digital tools to create alternative ways to explore cities. ReWalk Europe will help tourists in European cities enjoy walking tours created by local artists.

Spread Culture winners

The stand-out idea in the Spread Culture category is Wiki Rail, the world's first interactive audiovisual guide for train passengers. It is created by German production company Filmband, and will not only provide passengers with real-time information about Europe's busiest train routes, but also relay information about the history, culture and monuments along the route through multimedia.

"Up to now train rides were only a means to an end, as transport from A to B," said Michael Hare Achim Berg of Filmband, presenting the project on stage at the forum. Places will now be "snatched from anonymity" to create a "cultural landscape" as you travel, he added.



StoryGuides

Slovenian project StoryGuides aim to show children the diversity of European societies through an augmented-reality app that relays local legends about European cities, while acting as a tour guide.

HE/DE has been created to foster creativity in Spain during the economic and social crisis the country is currently suffering. It's an app based around the problem of abandoned furniture being left on the streets of Spanish cities and it encourages citizens to share, collect and refurbish the furniture as a fresh method of innovation.

The Yugo app provides a personalised suggestion of one cultural event per day for users. The suggestion will be based on your location and personal profile, and as you rate events over time, suggestions will learn to adapt to your tastes.

Access Culture winners

Another UK endeavour is Poetrycloud, which is described by Wingedchariot, the company that has created it, as a "literary Instagram". Based on the Victorian tradition of gifting favourite poems to loved ones, Poetrycloud will allow people to create digital anthologies of their favourite verses.

The MuseoFabber project from Greece wants to make use of the digital museum archives by providing public access to the 3D printing blueprints for musuem artefacts across Europe.

One winner, Travelling Hospitals, hopes to help children in hospitals by taking them on virtual trips around Europe. Twice a month destinations will be proposed to the children and they will pack their bags, go to a cultural event, meet artists and go backstage.

The final winner in the Acess Culture category is Deaf Magazine, a proposal for a new multimedia publication aimed at the 80,000 people in Germany who consider German sign language to be their first language.

Youth winner

The youth category of the competition is one Androulla Vassiliou feels particularly strongly about. "The idea is to encourage the young ones to be creative, to be innovative and to support them. If we want to encourage the participation of young ones, we have to support them because of their age," she says.


The prize was won by a project from the UK called Narrated Film Downloads, which aims to open up access to the experience of listening to narrated films or audio films to audiences beyond the visually impaired, bringing them out of their niche and into daily life.

Beyond the awards

Member of the competition jury Ghislaine Boddington said that she was impressed by the "depth of content" in the winning entries -- something, she adds, which is often missing in proposals she encounters in the tech and cultural sectors. She also praised the originality of the entries, saying that so often she sees proposals for projects that are already being done by someone somewhere else.

All of the winners will now receive training in areas of legal, copyright, distribution, financing and on how to put together a

business plan. From there they will have the opportunity to pitch their projects to investors.



"The final stage will be when they will share their experiences with others, in order to encourage others to do the same, to innovate," says Vassiliou. "Because especially in young people imagination is very rich, but they need encouragement. So by sharing their experiences, the mistakes they made, the lessons they have learnt, it's also an important part of our job, because we don't want to support 12 people or 12 teams, but we want to share it with others so we create a new culture for innovation."

This is just the first stage for @diversity, she adds and the EU will continue to encourage innovation within creativity as core part of its Creative Europe program

"This will certainly not be a one-off project, because we see the advantages -- the people who participated will have a tremendous experience during this time, but of course we don't finish today -- today is just a presentation of the ideas that came forward."
